
Global Tropics Hazards/Benefits Assessment - Climate Prediction Center - Issued: 11/23/2009

Week 1 Outlook - Valid: November 24 - 30, 2009



- 1. <u>An increased chance for below-average rainfall for east-central Brazil.</u> Numerical forecast guidance indicates decreased rainfall in this region for much of the period. <u>Confidence: High</u>
- 2. <u>An increased chance for above-average rainfall in southeast Brazil.</u> Numerical forecast guidance indicates enhanced rainfall in this region for much of the period. Confidence: High
- **3.** <u>An increased chance for below-average rainfall for parts of eastern Africa and the west-central Indian Ocean.</u> The suppressed phase of the MJO favors decreased rainfall in this region. <u>Confidence: High</u>
- **4.** <u>An increased chance for above-average rainfall for the north central Maritime Continent.</u> Numerical forecast guidance indicates a tropical disturbance may impact this region which favors enhanced rainfall in this region. <u>Confidence: High</u>
- **5.** <u>An increased chance for above-average rainfall for the equatorial west Pacific.</u> The enhanced phase of the MJO and El Nino conditions favor enhanced rainfall in this region. <u>Confidence: High</u>

Western Pacific Ocean: Tropical Storm Ida (8.8N, 147.0E) → Consult updates from the Joint Typhoon Warning Center.

Southern Indian Ocean: Tropical Storm Two (8.9S, 53.6E) → Consult updates from the Joint Typhoon Warning Center.


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Week 2 Outlook - Valid: December 1 - 7, 2009



1. An increased chance for above-average rainfall for east central Brazil. The enhanced phase of the MJO favors increased rainfall in this region.

2. <u>An increased chance for below-average rainfall for portions of the Indian Ocean and western Maritime Continent.</u> The suppressed phase of the MJO favors decreased rainfall in this region. <u>Confidence: Moderate</u>

3. <u>An increased chance for above-average rainfall for the equatorial west Pacific.</u> The enhanced phase of the MJO and El Nino conditions favor increased rainfall in this region. <u>Confidence: Moderate</u>
